

JUNIOR CLUB LICENCE INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

What is it for?

This licence is issued to persons under the age of 18 years who use handguns (Cat H firearms) under supervision at a Club for sport shooting.

Who needs these Licences?

This is the only licence available to those under the age of 18 years that allows them to use Cat H firearms at a Club.

Is there an age restriction?

Yes, these Licences are only available to person under the age of 18 years. Licences will not be issued to those under the age of 12 years.

What must First Timers for H class do?

Applicants will have to do the three month Sport Shooters Permit first – they must provide a 'Certificate of Firearm Club Membership' - PF474A (support to shoot under supervision), a parent / guardian consent letter, fill out an 'Application for – Shooters Licence / Sport Shooters Permit / Cat H Sport Shooters Licence / Junior Club Licence*' (PF444) and pay required fee.

What about category A, B or C firearms?

Yes, a Junior Club Licence can be issued for these categories, but only where the use of the firearm is for sport shooting.

Which form do I use?

Use the 'Application for – Shooters Licence / Sport Shooters Permit / Cat H Sport Shooters Licence / Junior Club Licence*' (PF444).

What do they have to provide?

The applicant will have to provide a 'Certificate of Firearm Club Membership' (PF474B). Also a letter from the parent / guardian stating they have permission to undertake the sport.

Does the 100 point check apply?

Yes, the 100 point check should be applied to these applicants.

Do they have to do the Firearms Exam?

No. They will have to undertake the exam when they apply for a licence after their 18th birthday.

Do they have to provide proof of safety storage?

No.
